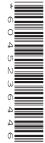

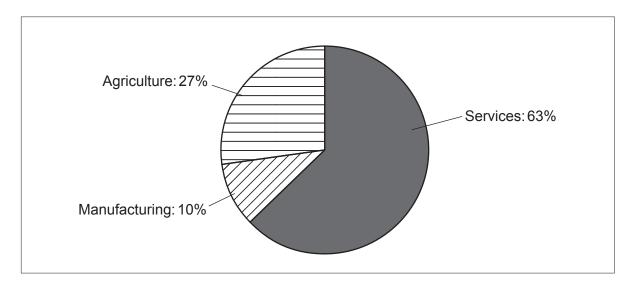


Fig. 1.1 Country A's industrial activities

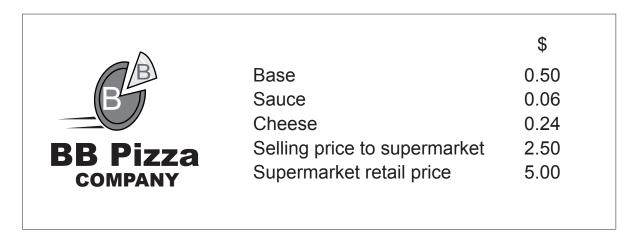

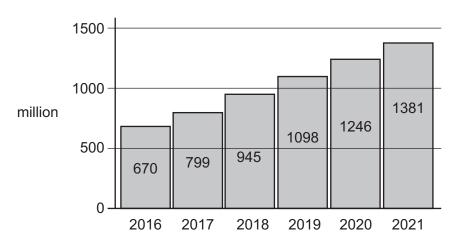
